
#### **10 THINGS TO KNOW ABOUT HPV:**

#### 10. HPV INFECTION IS COMMON



Most HPV infections will go away on their own. Infections that don't go away can cause precancers and cancers.





#### 9. HPV INFECTION CAN CAUSE CANCER

From 2011 - 2015, It's estimated that HPV caused over 33,000 cancers in the United States each year


# 8. PREVENTING CANCER IS BETTER THAN TREATING IT

- Oral Pharyngeal cancer is also known as squamous cell carcinoma of the pharynx including the base of the tongue and tonsils.
- Unlike oral cavity cancer OPC is linked to the HPV.
- Conduct extra/intra oral cancer screenings.
- HPV causes 70% of OPCs in the U.S.




Infections with HPV types that cause most HPV cancers and genital warts have dropped 71 percent among teen girls.

Plus girls 13-26 years old who haven't started or finished HPV vaccine series




Plus boys 13-21 years old who haven't started or finished HPV vaccine series





### 2. PRETEENS ONLY NEED TWO DOSES OF HPV VACCINE




Data now shows 2 doses of HPV vaccine provide similar protection to 3 doses, when given before the 15th birthday.
